

**Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund Report

In January 2021 Huntington Junior College (OPE ID: 009047) was awarded funds under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA). Additional funds were awarded under the American Rescue Plan in June 2021. This Fund Report applies to these funds received under the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund section, designated exclusively for emergency financial aid grants to students. The institution appreciates that Congress and the President made these critical funds available for eligible students who had expenses due to the continuing Coronavirus pandemic. We take receipt of these federal funds seriously and have distributed them in accordance with the CRRSAA, ARP and the Department's implementation guidance. The institution is making the below information available for transparency purposes and in compliance with the U.S. Department of Education.

1. The institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students. The institution has used 100% of the funds received under CRRSAA and ARP to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.
2. The total amount of funds that the institution was awarded from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students is \$292,793 under CRRSAA and \$150,590 under ARP for a total of \$443,383.
3. The total amount of emergency financial aid grants distributed to students under CRRSAA/ARP as of the date of this Fund Report, March 31, 2022 is \$443,383.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to receive CRRSAA emergency financial aid grants during this time period is 265.
5. The total number of students who have received an emergency financial aid grant under CRRSAA as of the date of this Fund Report is 246.
6. The methods used by the institution to determine which students receive emergency financial aid grants and how much they would receive is included in Attachment A.
7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the emergency financial aid grants are provided at Attachment B.

Funds were initially disbursed to eligible active students in a check mailed directly to the student at the beginning of the quarter. Based on continuing costs, due to the continuing COVID pandemic, an additional \$250-\$350 (based on efc and dependent children) was awarded to active students at the end of the quarter.

These final disbursements used the balance of HEERF funds available for grants to students.

Only current students who are actively participating in classes are eligible to receive these funds. These checks will come directly to you and will not affect your financial aid eligibility or amounts.
